Isolation Procedures for Positive Test Cases [CDC]	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> isolate for at least 5 days, "Day 0" is the day of the positive viral test; Isolation can end after "day 5" if symptoms are not present or are resolving and a diagnostic specimen* collected on Day 5 or later tests negative. (*Antigen test recommended) infected persons should wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings If unable to test, choosing not to test, or testing positive on Day 5 (or later), isolation can end after Day 10 if fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications If fever is present, isolation should be continued until 24 hours after fever resolves. If symptoms, other than fever, are not resolving, continue to isolate until symptoms are resolving or until after Day 10.
Exposure*, symptomatic	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Isolate and get tested within 3 – 5 days after last exposure Close contacts should wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings if positive follow Isolation Procedures for Positive Test Cases If negative, return to school/work if – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> At least 24 hours have passed since resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications; AND Other symptoms are improving; AND Person has a negative test for SARS-CoV-2, OR a healthcare provider has provided documentation an another diagnosed issue is responsible for the symptoms
Exposure*, asymptomatic (Persons infected within the prior 90 days do not need to be tested, quarantined, or excluded from work unless symptoms develop.)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> No isolation, but must get tested within 3 – 5 days after last exposure Asymptomatic, exposed students and staff are permitted to return to school/work, if <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tested in day 3 – 5 and negative If positive or symptoms develop, follow applicable protocols above Mask recommended
Symptomatic, no known exposure	<p>Stay home until –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Medical provider confirms that symptom(s) is related to non-COVID, non-communicable issue (School/Dept needs note), or 24 hours have passed since fever resolution without use of fever-reducing medications, AND Symptoms are improving, or ten (10) days have passed since symptom onset, AND Symptomatic person has a negative test result for SARS-CoV2
Masks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> As of March 12, 2022, in school settings masks are no longer required; although CDPH continues to "strongly recommend" their use
Social Distancing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CDPH recommends focusing on other mitigation strategies instead of implementing minimum physical distancing requirements for routine classroom instruction

***Exposure** is defined as being within 0 -6 feet of a confirmed COVID19 case for greater than 15 minutes in the aggregate over a 24-hr period.
